G. TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SCHOOL DENTAL CLINIC DUE TO CONSTRUCTION OF THE STUDENT SERVICES HUB FROM 10 JULY 2025

The school will be constructing a Student Service Hub (SSH) which is a one-stop facility for student support services. The SSH aims to promote and destigmatize help-seeking behaviours amongst students by encouraging walk-in consultations, and to support a more holistic and responsive case management system by collocating different specialised staff (e.g. School Counsellors, Special Education Needs Officers) together, thereby facilitating collaboration amongst them while optimising the use of the various counselling/ intervention rooms.

The areas affected by the construction includes rooms at Block A Level 1 e.g. the School Dental Clinic and School Counsellor's room. The renovation works will commence from 10 July 2025 and will take around 3 months. During this period, the School Dental Clinic will close. Students who require dental services during this period can approach the Dental Clinics at Choa Chu Kang Primary School and South View Primary School.

The school will send out registration forms to all P3 pupils in July 2025. Please note that this exercise is not compulsory for P3 pupils to take part. Pupils who are not participating in the GEP Screening Exercise will be engaged separately in other lesson activities. Normal lessons continue after 12.00 p.m.

The GEP Identification Exercise aims to identify suitable pupils with high intellectual potential. Test-preparation activities could inflate pupils' scores and not reflect their actual potential. Pupils who are not ready to handle the intellectual rigour and demands of the programme will struggle with the enriched curriculum and not benefit fully from it. This would put undue stress on the pupils and may even cause them to lose confidence and impact their self-esteem.

M. LOWER PRIMARY MINI IPW PROGRAMME AND LEARNING JOURNEY

This year, the school is starting a Mini-IPW (Interdisciplinary Project Work) programme specially for our Primary 1 and Primary 2 students. IPW gives students the chance to bring together what they learn from different subjects and apply their knowledge in creative and practical ways to real-life situations.

For the lower primary levels, the Mini-IPW lessons will take place during E3 Reasoning lessons in Term 3. The themes and schedule for each level are:

To help students better understand the themes, the school has planned learning journeys that are closely linked to the Mini-IPW topics. These learning journeys are part of the project work and are not separate activities. By experiencing real-world situations, students can observe more closely, build empathy, and come up with meaningful ideas for their projects.

With this thoughtful integration, students will gain first-hand experiences that will support their learning and help them in their project work. We believe this will make learning more fun, meaningful, and engaging for our students.

N. RACIAL HARMONY DAY COMMEMORATION

The school will be commemorating Racial Harmony Day (RHD) on 21 July 2025 (Monday). The theme for RHD this year is "Our People, Our Tapestry" which highlights the importance of appreciating and celebrating Singapore's diverse cultures and the collaborative effort needed to maintain social cohesion. The commemoration will be held in the hall with an assembly programme, classroom and recess activities that highlight the diversity of cultures and the importance of racial harmony in Singapore.

O. PREVIEW OF NATIONAL DAY PARADE

Q. MOTHER TONGUE FORTNIGHT 2025

To create an immersive environment for the learning of MTL, the school has designated two weeks (Term 3, Weeks 1 and 2) for Mother Tongue Fortnight, during which a wide range of activities related to the Chinese, Malay, and Tamil languages and cultures will be conducted. During these two weeks, a variety of hands-on cultural and cross-cultural activities will be conducted for P1 to P6 students, providing them with an authentic and joyful learning experience.

R. PRIMARY 3 SWIMSAFER PROGRAMME 2025

Swimming is a key learning area in the Physical Education (PE) syllabus, and schools leverage the SwimSafer programme to help students achieve the intended learning outcomes.
